The author's account of Franklin's personal life, drawn largely from the surviving correspondence, much of it unpublished, between Franklin and his family and friends.

5. Meador, Roy. **Franklin – Revolutionary scientist**. Michigan : Ann Arbor Science Publishers Inc., 1975.

The author deals with Franklin the scientist and Franklin the man, on equal terms.

6. Bowen, Catherine Drinker. **The most dangerous man in America: scenes from the life of Benjamin Franklin**. New York : Little, Brown, and Company, 1974.

Mrs. Bowen unfolds a selective narrative, beginning with scenes of Franklin's boyhood in Boston; at the Albany Congress of 1754 and ending just before the Revolution, which shows the versatility of this American at his best.

7. Van Doren, Carl. **Benjamin Franklin**. New York : The Viking Press, 1952.

This book contains an extensive collection of Benjamin Franklin's autobiographical writings, much of which was long out-of-print. Also included are some fifty letters written by Franklin that was never published before.
