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## REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS – CONSTRUCTION

### A. PRICE

The contractor shall complete all work, including furnishing all labor, material, equipment and services required under this purchase order for the following firm fixed price and within the time specified. This price shall include all labor, materials, overhead and profit.

### B. STATEMENT OF WORK

Introduction. This project is to provide the remodeling services for US Embassy Health Unit, Rooms 130-141, and Rooms 152 and 153 as detailed in **Attachment #1**. The character and scope of the work are set forth in the contract. The cost of any materials or equipment required in conjunction with the services rendered herein shall be included in the proposed firm fixed-price.

In case of differences between small and large-scale drawings, the latter will govern. Where a portion of the work is drawn in detail and the remainder of the work is indicated in outline, the parts drawn in detail shall apply also to all other portions of the work.

The contractor shall schedule work performance to ensure that it is done in the order and time frame that are most efficient and have the least impact on normal operations. Contractor employees shall be on site only for contractual duties and not for other business purposes.

### C. PACKAGING AND MARKING

Packaging and marking shall follow commercial practice.

The Contractor shall address letters and all deliverables as listed below:

### D. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

The COR, or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect from time to time the services being performed and the supplies furnished to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all supplies are of acceptable quality and standards.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

#### D.1 Substantial Completion: Definitions

(a) "Substantial Completion" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined and certified by the Contracting Officer in writing to the Contractor, on which the work (or a portion designated by the Government) is sufficiently complete and satisfactory. Substantial completion means that the property may be occupied or used for the purpose for which it is intended, and only minor items such as touch-up, adjustments, and minor replacements or installations remain to be completed or corrected which:

- (1) do not interfere with the intended occupancy or utilization of the work, and
- (2) can be completed or corrected within the time period required for final completion.

(b) The "date of substantial completion" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer or authorized Government representative as of which substantial completion of the work has been achieved.

#### D.2 Use and Possession upon Substantial Completion

The Government shall have the right to take possession of and use the work upon substantial completion. Upon notice by the Contractor that the work is substantially complete (a Request for Substantial Completion) and an inspection by the Contracting Officer or an authorized Government representative (including any required tests), the Contracting Officer shall furnish the Contractor a Certificate of Substantial Completion. The certificate will be accompanied by a Schedule of Defects listing items of work remaining to be performed, completed or corrected before final completion and acceptance. Failure of the Contracting Officer to list any item of work shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility for complying with the terms of the contract. The Government's possession or use upon substantial completion shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work under the contract.

#### D.3 Final Completion and Acceptance: Definitions

(a) "Final completion and acceptance" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined by the Contracting Officer and confirmed in writing to the Contractor, at which all work required under the contract has been completed in a satisfactory manner, subject to the discovery of defects after final completion, and except for items specifically excluded in the notice of final acceptance.

(b) The "date of final completion and acceptance" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer when final completion of the work has been achieved, as indicated by written notice to the Contractor.

#### D.4 Final Inspection and Tests

The Contractor shall give the Contracting Officer at least seven (7) days advance written notice of the date when the work will be fully completed and ready for final inspection and tests. Final inspection and tests will be started not later than the date specified in the notice unless the Contracting Officer determines that the work is not ready for final inspection and so informs the Contractor.

#### D.5 Final Acceptance

If the Contracting Officer is satisfied that the work under the contract is complete (with the exception of continuing obligations), the Contracting Officer shall issue to the Contractor a notice of final acceptance and make final payment upon:

- Satisfactory completion of all required tests,
- a final inspection that all items by the Contracting Officer listed in the Schedule of Defects have been completed or corrected and that the work is finally complete (subject to the discovery of defects after final completion), and
- submittal by the Contractor of all documents and other items required upon completion of the work, including a final request for payment (Request for Final Acceptance).

### E. DELIVERIES OR PERFORMANCE

#### E.1 52.211-10 COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION, AND COMPLETION OF WORK (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to:

- (a) commence work under this contract within **three (3) working days** after the date the Contractor receives the notice to proceed (NTP),
- (b) prosecute the work diligently, and,
- (c) complete the entire work ready for use not later than **thirty (30) calendar days** after receiving the NTP.

The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises and completion of punch list items.

#### E.2 52.211-12 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES - CONSTRUCTION (SEP 2000)

- (a) If the Contractor fails to complete the work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the Government in the amount of **\$100.00 (one-hundred US dollars)** for each calendar day of delay until the work is completed or accepted.
- (b) If the Government terminates the Contractor's right to proceed, liquidated damages will continue to accrue until the work is completed. These liquidated damages are in addition to excess costs of repurchase under the Default clause.

#### E.3 CONTRACTOR'S SUBMISSION OF CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULES

- (a) The time for submission of the schedules referenced in FAR 52.236-15, "Schedules for Construction Contracts", paragraph (a), is hereby modified to reflect the due date for submission as **"5 calendar days** after receipt of an executed contract".
- (b) These schedules shall include the time by which shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals required by the contract will be submitted for approval.

- (c) The Contractor shall revise such schedules (1) to account for the actual progress of the work, (2) to reflect approved adjustments in the performance schedule, and (3) as required by the Contracting Officer to achieve coordination with work by the Government and any separate contractors used by the Government. The Contractor shall submit a schedule, which sequences work so as to minimize disruption at the job site.
- (d) All deliverables shall be in the English language and any system of dimensions (English or metric) shown shall be consistent with that used in the contract. No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Government in approving such deliverables if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required by the contract.
- (e) Acceptance of Schedule: When the Government has accepted any time schedule; it shall be binding upon the Contractor. The completion date is fixed and may be extended only by a written contract modification signed by the Contracting Officer. Acceptance or approval of any schedule or revision thereof by the Government shall not:
  - (1) Extend the completion date or obligate the Government to do so,
  - (2) Constitute acceptance or approval of any delay, or
  - (3) Excuse the Contractor from or relieve the Contractor of its obligation to maintain the progress of the work and achieve final completion by the established completion date.

#### E.4 NOTICE OF DELAY

If the Contractor receives a notice of any change in the work, or if any other conditions arise which are likely to cause or are actually causing delays which the Contractor believes may result in late completion of the project, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's notice shall state the effect, if any, of such change or other conditions upon the approved schedule, and shall state in what respects, if any, the relevant schedule or the completion date should be revised. The Contractor shall give such notice promptly, not more than ten (10) days after the first event giving rise to the delay or prospective delay. Only the Contracting Officer may make revisions to the approved time schedule.

#### E.5 NOTICE TO PROCEED

- (a) After receiving and accepting the insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide the Contractor a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the time period established in the contract.
- (b) It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before receipt and acceptance of any bonds or evidence of insurance. Issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required bonds or insurance certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

E.6 WORKING HOURS

All work shall be performed during **8:00 am through 5:00 pm from Monday through Friday, and 8:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday**. Other hours, if requested by the Contractor, may be approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). The Contractor shall give 24 hours in advance to COR who will consider any deviation from the hours identified above. Changes in work hours, initiated by the Contractor, will not be a cause for a price increase.

E.7 PRECONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

A preconstruction conference will be held **three (3) days** after contract award at the US Embassy Compound, building #783, located in Demetrio B. Lakas, in the Clayton neighborhood of Panama City, Panama, to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that effect construction progress. See FAR 52.236-26, Preconstruction Conference.

**F. ADMINISTRATIVE DATA**

F.1. 652.242-70 CONTRACTING OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVE (COR) (AUG 1999)

- (a) The Contracting Officer may designate in writing one or more Government employees, by name or position title, to take action for the Contracting Officer under this contract. Each designee shall be identified as a Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Such designation(s) shall specify the scope and limitations of the authority so delegated; provided, that the designee shall not change the terms or conditions of the contract, unless the COR is a warranted Contracting Officer and this authority is delegated in the designation.
- (b) The COR for this contract is ***Elias Cartin, Facilities Engineer.***

F.2. PAYMENT

The Contractor's attention is directed to Section H, 52.232-5, "Payments Under Fixed-Price Construction Contracts". The following elaborates on the information contained in that clause.

Requests for payment may be made no more frequently than monthly. Payment requests shall cover the value of labor and materials completed and in place, including a prorated portion of overhead and profit.

Invoices shall reflect the contract number and the name of the COR.

After receipt of the Contractor's request for payment, and on the basis of an inspection of the work, the Contracting Officer shall make a determination as to the amount, which is then due. If the Contracting Officer does not approve payment of the full amount applied for, less the retainage allowed by in 52.232-5, the Contracting Officer shall advise the Contractor as to the reasons.

Under the authority of 52.232-27(a), the 14 day period identified in FAR 52.232-27(a)(1)(i)(A) is hereby changed to 30 days.

G. **SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

G.1 RESERVED

G.2 INSURANCE

The Contractor is required by FAR 52.228-5, "Insurance - Work on a Government Installation" to provide whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall at its own expense provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts:

General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

1. Bodily Injury stated in US Dollars:
  - a. Per Person ***\$100,000***
  - b. Per Occurrence ***\$100,000***
  
2. Property Damage stated in US Dollars:
  - a. Per Occurrence ***\$300,000***
  
3. ***Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability***
  - a. ***Workers' Compensational and Occupational Disease Statutory, as required by Panamanian Law***

b. *Employee's Liability*

***\$100,000***

The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising there from, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State," as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

G.3 DOCUMENT DESCRIPTIONS

Supplemental Documents: The Contracting Officer shall furnish from time to time such detailed drawings and other information as is considered necessary, in the opinion of the Contracting Officer, to interpret, clarify, supplement, or correct inconsistencies, errors or omissions in the Contract documents, or to describe minor changes in the work not involving an increase in the contract price or extension of the contract time. The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the supplemental documents, and unless prompt objection is made by the Contractor within 20 days, their issuance shall not provide for any claim for an increase in the Contract price or an extension of contract time.

Record Documents. The Contractor shall maintain at the project site:

- (1) a current marked set of Contract drawings and specifications indicating all interpretations and clarification, contract modifications, change orders, or any other departure from the contract requirements approved by the Contracting Officer; and,
- (2) a complete set of record shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals as approved by the Contracting Officer.

"As-Built" Documents: After final completion of the work, but before final acceptance thereof, the Contractor shall provide:

- (1) a complete set of "as-built" drawings, based upon the record set of drawings, marked to show the details of construction as actually accomplished; and,
- (2) record shop drawings and other submittals, in the number and form as required by the specifications.

#### G.4 LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all laws, codes, permits, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, including those of the host country, and with the lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Host country authorities may not enter the construction site without the permission of the Contracting Officer. Unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall comply with the more stringent of the requirements of such laws, regulations and orders and of the contract. In the event of a conflict between the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the Contractor shall promptly advise the Contracting Officer of the conflict and of the Contractor's proposed course of action for resolution by the Contracting Officer.

The Contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, to the extent that such compliance is not inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

The Contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all requisite licenses and permits.

The Contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer of compliance with this clause.

#### G.5 CONSTRUCTION PERSONNEL

The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing, that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

The Contractor shall provide an English speaking supervisor on site at all times. This position is considered as key personnel under this purchase order.

#### G.6 MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

All materials and equipment incorporated into the work shall be new and for the purpose intended, unless otherwise specified. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner that will withstand inspection by the Contracting Officer.

## G.7 SPECIAL WARRANTIES

Any special warranties that may be required under the contract shall be subject to the stipulations set forth in 52.246-21, "Warranty of Construction", as long as they are not in conflict.

***Contractor shall provide twelve (12) months guarantee of construction.***

The Contractor shall obtain and furnish to the Government all information required to make any subcontractor's, manufacturer's, or supplier's guarantee or warranty legally binding and effective. The contractor shall submit both the information and the guarantee or warranty to the Government in sufficient time to permit the Government to meet any time limit specified in the guarantee or warranty, but not later than completion and acceptance of all work under this contract.

## G.8 EQUITABLE ADJUSTMENTS

Any circumstance for which the contract provides an equitable adjustment that causes a change within the meaning of paragraph (a) of the "Changes" clause shall be treated as a change under that clause; provided, that the Contractor gives the Contracting Officer prompt written notice (within 20 days) stating:

- (a) the date, circumstances, and applicable contract clause authorizing an equitable adjustment and
- (b) that the Contractor regards the event as a changed condition for which an equitable adjustment is allowed under the contract.

The Contractor shall provide written notice of a differing site condition within 10 calendar days of occurrence following FAR 52.236-2, Differing Site Conditions.

## G.9 ZONING APPROVALS AND PERMITS

The Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining and paying for any permits required by Panamanian law to perform the work stated in this contract.

## H. **CLAUSES**

### DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT


Remodeling Services will take place in the Embassy Health Unit, Rooms 130-141, and in Rooms 152 and 153, first floor, US Embassy, Panama City, Panama.

The Scope of Work refers to Attachment #2, drawings entitled “Health Unit Demolition/Relocation Plan” (Drawing 1) and Health Unit Proposed Plan” (Drawing 2), and “Partition Types” (Drawing 3), and consist of the following:

- A. Rooms 140 and 139: A section of existing wall and one door shall be removed as shown in Drawing 1. Remove all existing shelving and one sink. Items stored in these rooms shall be relocated across the hall in room 150. Construct a new wall to align with the hallway wall side of room 138 as shown in Drawing 2. Install carpet and cove base in new room 139, manufacturer and color/style to match Embassy standards. Repaint new room 139, color to match manufacturer/color/style existing in room and hallway. Relocate thermostat currently on exterior wall of room 140. Install one 120-V power outlet and one connection block that house 4 sets of wiring – Phone, OpenNet, Internet, Network Printer. Wires should be CAT 6 in three colors – (2) Orange, (1) Blue, and (1) Green. New furnishings as depicted in Drawing 2 will be provided by the US Embassy.
- B. Room 138: Remove L-shaped section of cabinets and countertop as shown in Drawing 1. Cabinets with sink are existing to remain; repair and finish end of countertop after cutting away the L section. Patch and paint existing walls in matching color. Relocate refrigerator to corridor 130. Relocate/lower three each electrical outlets; currently located above countertops which will be removed in this project. Install one 120-V power outlet and one connection block that house 4 sets of wiring – Phone, OpenNet, Internet, Network Printer- Wires should be CAT 6 in three colors – (2) Orange, (1) Blue, and (1) Green for each desk. The US Embassy will provide the new desk and return as shown in Drawing 2.
- C. Room 135: Install one 120-V power outlet and one connection block that house 4 sets of wiring – Phone, OpenNet, Internet, Network Printer - Wires should be CAT 6 in three colors – (2) Orange, (1) Blue, and (1) Green for the additional desk. US Embassy will provide one additional desk with return; privacy partition and chair as shown in Drawing 2.
- D. Corridor 130: Remove sufficient cabinets and countertop in corridor to provide space for refrigerator (relocated from room 138) as shown in Drawing 1. Provide power and phone/alarm line in corridor for refrigerator as shown in Drawing 2. Relocate book cases to newly constructed closet.
- E. Room 152: Install new wall and door w/frame behind Cashier Station to create a closet as shown in the drawings. The door and frame removed from room 140 can and should be used for the CLO closet. Construct shelving where shown in the drawing. Items stored in room 150 are to be relocated to newly constructed Room 153B. The CLO closet (room 153B) will include independent lighting circuit with wall switch.

- F. Any water line (from sinks) terminations should terminate above the ceiling. Any new enclosed space will require adequate HVAC ducting—to include return.
- G. The new dry wall partitions for Room 139 and to create a closet Room 153B shall be constructed in accordance with the PARTITION TYPES (Type P-1C for Room 139 & Room 152/153B) of adjacent walls. See NOB Issued for Construction Drawing Number NOB.G0.004. (Drawing 3: PARTITION TYPES).



- ② Remove "L" section of countertop and lower and upper cabinets in room 138, finish exposed end of countertop to remain. Patch and paint walls, color to match existing.

- ③ Relocate bookcases in Corridor 130 to across-the-hall storage room 150
- ④ Create opening in wall between rooms 152 and 153 for new door and frame where shown.

- ② Install new carpet tile and cove base in room 139; patch and paint both rooms to match existing color.
- ③ Install one power connection and one connection block that house four sets of wiring- Phone, OpenNet, Internet, Network Printer - Wires should be CAT 6 in three colors - (2) Orange, (1) Blue, and (1) Green for each desk - rooms 138 & 139.
- ④ Install one power connection and one connection block that house four sets of wiring- Phone, OpenNet, Internet, Network Printer - Wires should be CAT 6 in three colors - (2) Orange, (1) Blue, and (1) Green for each desk - room 135.
- ⑤ Install new wall and door with frame in room 152 to create a closet. Construct shelving where shown. Mount sign next to door showing room number 153B.
